- 1-3 Letters of Recommendation (gathered by the applicant from each recommender in a sealed envelope with the recommender's signature across the seal)
- Transcripts (gathered by the applicant from the appropriate school(s) or university(ies) in a sealed envelope)
- Repertoire List
- GRE score report (general test only) the applicant must submit a copy of his/her
  personal score report to the Thornton Admission office, as well as arrange for ETS to
  send an official score report directly to the USC Admission office
- TOEFL score report required from all applicants for whom English is a second language, regardless of educational background or immigration status

### **Audition Information**

A performance audition is required of all applicants to this program. The audition will be in two sections: (1) the piano solo section and (2) the collaborative section. The piano solo section should include two piano solos, performed from memory from contrasting stylistic

periods. If any of the selections are taken from a multi-movement sonata or concerto, applicants need only prepare one movement of the piece. The collaborative section should include two complete instrumental sonatas, four songs from contrasting stylistic periods and one aria, all performed with music. Any questions in regard to collaborative repertoire may be directed to the collaborative arts office by calling (213) 740-7703. Additionally, at the Los Angeles auditions, students will be tested on their sight-reading ability and may be asked to demonstrate their skills in diction and translation.
