JUNIOR YEAR

PREPARE & REGISTER

- Complete Pop Music Performance III (MPPM 320)
- As an upperclassman, discuss with your faculty your aspirations as a performer. Consider exploring Host Institution faculty to develop your international professional network.

PREPARE & REGISTER

Finalize Plans Abroad

6-9 months prior to departure

- Complete Pre-Departure requirements
 - Plan a budget
 - Apply for study abroad scholarships
- Complete the following the semester before your departure:**
- Get your Academic Learning Agreement approved
 - Register to appropriate section of USC 300 Overseas Block Enrollment
 - Confirm USC Financial Aid Package for semester abroad
