ACADEMIC POLICIES

Academic Standards

- Minimum cumulative GPA for graduation: 3.0
- Complete total number of units required
- Complete non-course requirements
- Minimum passing grade for credit in the department of your major: B
- Minimum passing grade for credit in other departments: C
- Minimum passing grade for MGEE review classes: B-
- All courses must be taken for letter grade



Music Graduate Entrance Exams (MGEE)

- Different exams required for different majors
- Any exam that is not passed will require a review course in that same subject area
- TAKE ALL REQUIRED EXAMS! Refer to the MGEE website for exam schedule.

MGEE Completion Policy

All MGEE requirements must be fulfilled within the first two semesters in a graduate degree program.

Failure to fulfill all MGEE requirements by the beginning of the third semester – either through exams or review courses – may delay permission to fulfill degree requirements such as recitals, qualifying examinations, thesis projects, and dissertations, and could have a negative effect on financial aid eligibility.

Advisement & Registration

Each semester, follow these steps to plan your schedule and register for classes:

- 1. Schedule an appointment with your advisor through online portal (Advise USC)
- 2. Prepare for your advising appointment
- 3. Meet with your advisor and obtain D-clearances
- 4. Register (using Web Registration)
- 5. Save your registration confirmation email



Registration-Related Items

Tuition Refund Insurance

Accept or decline as part of the registration process each semester

Individual Instruction Fee

Added to tuition for each unit of individual instruction

Settling Your Bill

Always settle by 5pm on the Friday before the first day of classes

Grade Options

Do not change the grade option to pass/no pass or audit for any classes. You will not receive degree credit.



Important Registration Deadlines

Deadline to Register and Pay Bill

Friday before the first day of classes

This semester - August 22

Deadline to Drop & Add (regular session)

Friday of the 3rd week of the semester
This semester – September 12

Deadline to Withdraw (regular session)

Friday of the 12th week of the semester

This semester - November 14



Verification of Prior Degrees

All graduate students (degree, certificate, and diploma) must verify that they have completed prerequisite degrees.

Timing: As soon as possible, but no later than the end of first semester. This can be a very time-consuming process, so get started on it early!

How: Log on to MyUSC and visit OASIS for registration restrictions. If you have a degree verification restriction, refer to the Thornton New Graduate Orientation website for instructions.

International Students

Important issues for international students to remember.

- Office of International Services (OIS) located in Royal Street Parking Structure, Suite 101
- Immigration Status Verification (ISV) must be completed before registering.
- Full-time registration required every semester: 6 units (DMA, PhD), 8 units (MA, MM, MS), 4 units (GCRT, ARTD)
- International Student English Examination (ISE) required only for students in a degree program if specified as a condition of admission
- American Language Institute (ALI) required for some students based on the results of ISE exam

USC Thornton

(aka FERPA or Buckley Amendment)

- Your academic records are your personal property
- This does not mean on-demand access
- We cannot legally discuss your academic record with anyone who is not you unless you grant permission.
- Permission for others to access your academic records can be granted via the OASIS system (link through your MyUSC page) under "Guest Account History."
